### Global Issues Activity Badge



Together, we can make the world a better place, and it all starts with you.

#### How to earn your badge:

**1. Find out about an international charity; what do they do and why is it important?**

Your chosen charity could support global issues such as water and sanitation, poverty, refugees and disaster relief.

**2. Monitor the waste you produce as a family and make a plan to reduce, reuse and recycle your household waste.**

**3. Find out about issues affecting the world.**

You could make a presentation about Covid-19. What is life like without going to school or scouting?

**4. Think about what you would need to survive if you became homeless because of a disaster, like flooding or an earthquake.**

Decide what your five most important things would be.

**5. Identify five belongings of yours that have come from other countries.**

Point out the countries on a map. Talk to others about why your belongings have come from so far away.

## Our World Challenge Award



Discover a whole world of cultures and traditions, right on your doorstep.

To earn your challenge badge you need to do at least one thing from each section.

### How to earn your badge:

#### 1. Create a community map.

What services are there? Where are they? Who are they for?

Create a presentation about one of these services. You might want to include photos, pictures, news reports and possibly write an article.

You can do this on paper, using technology or both!

#### 2. Identify and complete an activity that benefits your local community.

How did it help others? How did the activity help you? What could you do next?

- Write a letter/card/poem or draw a picture and send it to someone who is living alone, in a care home or might need cheering up.
- Paint pebbles and leave them on your walks for other people to find, to cheer them up.
- Draw and display a rainbow picture in your window.
- Print the picture (on 3<sup>rd</sup> page) colour and display in your window.
- Have a penny jar. Collect pennies which can be donated to a local charity of your choice.
- Plan a fundraising event which can be completed at a later date (when we are all out and about again).
  - Who is the fundraising for?
  - Make a poster? (leave space to add a date later)
  - What are you going to do?

#### 3. Take part in an act of worship, reflection or celebration.

- Many services are being shown live on YouTube.
- You could have your own family (or friends) reflection time, share a story or poem, talk about your hopes, dreams, fears. (you can do this over the phone or on video chat if you want to)

- Celebrate a religious or cultural festival. (e.g. Easter, Passover, Baisakhi, Mayday, St. Georges day)
- Via a video link, join with family or friends and celebrate a special occasion together.

#### **4. Find out about a faith or culture you are not familiar with.**

You could research a faith or culture other than your own. Create a display or make some craft, music food from your chosen topic.

#### **5. Talk about a time when you did your best.**

Explain how you have kept your Cub Promise and the Law.

You could keep a diary about life without going to school or scouting. What are you doing each day to 'help other people and do you best'?

#### **6. Take part in an activity about the environment.**

Think about how your activity helps the environment

- Build a bird box or bird feeder.
- Build a bug hotel
- Do some gardening (plant some flowers or vegetables)
- Create a poster about how to look after the environment.
- Recycle your rubbish at home.
- Start a compost heap.
- Watch a programme about looking after our environment.

#### **7. Play a game that Cubs play in another country and learn their Promise.**

- Use the internet to research games children play in other countries, and have a go at recreating them at home.
- Find out about another countries cub scout promise and law, how are their uniforms different, and what badge does everyone wear?
- Learn to sign the Cub Scout Promise.
